RELATED FIELDS

Fifteen semester hours must be chosen with Departmental Advisor. At least three hours must be in an approved course that provides an overview of Chinese history. An additional six semester hours from appropriate courses in Art, Humanities, Social/Behavioral Sciences and Business.
