**CLAS Bridge courses** (NOTE: New courses are periodically added; please see the "Bridge Course" flyer or look on the CLAS website for an updated list.) The Bridge course requirement cannot be double counted to fill other requirements for the university or college. Courses in **bold** *may* count toward the major, see an advisor to choose those courses.
