INITIAL TEACHER CERTIFICATION PROGRAM (ITC):

For specific College of Education ITC courses, consult with a College of Education advisor. Students should wait to apply to the ITC program until they have taken French courses on the 300-level. It is strongly recommended that the requirements in FRENCH be met fully <u>before</u> student teaching (SED 478) is undertaken. Exceptions will be permitted only upon the express recommendation of the supervising advisor in French.

Two methods courses, required as part of the ITC, are offered through the Department of Languages and Literatures: FLA 394 (Introduction to Teaching Foreign Languages), usually offered in Fall, and FLA 480 (Methods of Teaching Foreign Languages), usually offered in Spring.
