University and College of Liberal Arts and Sciences Requirements

Students seeking a Bachelor’s degree in Psychology must satisfy 3 sets of requirements: those set down by the Department of Psychology, those of the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences and those of the University. In addition, students must accumulate at least **120** credits, of which at least **45** must be upper-division. The department requirements are described on the previous page, and the College and University requirements are described here. For a complete description, consult the ASU General Catalog. For Psychology students, some of the College and University requirements can be fulfilled by careful cross-listing of required courses. Such courses are shown in *italics* next to the requirement they fulfill.
