Students seeking a Bachelor's degree in Psychology must satisfy 3 sets of requirements: those set down by the Department of Psychology, those of the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences and those of the University. In addition, students must accumulate at least $\mathbf{1 2 0}$ credits, of which at least $\mathbf{4 5}$ must be upper-division. For Psychology students, some of the College and University requirements can be fulfilled by careful cross-listing of required courses. Such courses are shown in italics next to the requirement they fulfill.
