**CRITERIA FOR GRADUATION FROM ASU COLLEGE OF NURSING**

(Student assumes full responsibility for meeting all graduation requirements.)

1.   **Meet all General Studies requirements of the University and all degree requirements of the College of Nursing with a grade of "C" or better.**
2.   **120 minimum total credit hours:**
  - a.   64 credit hours Nursing
  - b.   56 credit hours General Studies and Electives
3.   **45 minimum credit hours of Upper Division courses.**
4.   **64 maximum credit hours from Community Colleges.**
5.   **60 maximum credit hours by comprehensive exams.**
6.   **30 maximum credit hours taken in residence at ASU.**
7.   **60 credit hours taken in residence at ASU are required to be eligible for honors recognition.**
8.   **The General Studies and Elective hours for some students may not add up to 56 because of transferring quarter hours of 2-3 credits instead of 3-4. Free electives may be taken to make the total of 120 credit hours required for graduation.**
