**How to use this check sheet:** List the course and prefix number that fulfills the corresponding requirement. In the appropriate column next to the course, write the number of semester credit hours. i.e. if you have completed the course, mark the number of hours under the C column. If it is a course that you have not earned a grade for yet, mark the number of semester credit hours under the NC column. If the course is an upper division course (Jr. or Sr. level, numbered 300-499 at ASU) also mark the number of credit hours in the UD column next to the course. Courses numbered 500 or above require special permission, ask for the petition form in graduation office in SS111. When cross listing courses (using the same class to fulfill two requirements) take extra care not to double count the credit hours. Write the number of hours under one of the requirements, and cross out the appropriate column under the cross-listed requirement.
