Special Considerations

- “C” minimum required in all academic specialization courses.
- Student teaching is two semesters: 1st semester - elementary and 2nd semester –secondary school.
- EPE/KIN 480, Methods of Physical Education has to be taken the first semester of student teaching.
- Please note that before you Student Teach, you are required to complete six EPE/KIN 110s and all uired required courses (EPE/KIN 200, 335, 340, 345, 352).
- Prerequisite for admission to PETPP: High priority is given to students having completed 4 credits of EPE/KIN 110 and three of the five core classes.
