RELATED FIELDS

Fifteen semester hours must be chosen with Departmental Advisor. <u>Six hours</u> must be JPN or KOR prefix courses such as Japanese language and calligraphy, Japanese literature in translation (FLA 421), and Korean language or culture. At least <u>three hours</u> must be in an approved course that provides an overview of Chinese history. An additional <u>six semester hours</u> from appropriate courses in Art, Humanities, Social/Behavioral Sciences and International Business.

NOTES FOR MAJOR:

- A grade of C or better must be achieved in all courses to be counted toward the major and related fields.
- A minimum of 12 upper-division hours in the major must be taken in residence at ASU Main.
- Pass/Fail courses cannot be used for the major or related courses.
- CHI 313 and CHI 314 must be taken in sequence.
- CHI 311 and 312 are designed for students who have lived in China or a Chinese-speaking environment.
- No more than 6 credits of 200-level CHI courses may be counted toward the major.
- At least 24 hours must be taken at the 300 or 400 level and must include at least 9 hours at the 400 level.
