**NOTES FOR MAJOR:**

- A grade of C or better must be achieved in all courses to be counted toward the major and related fields.
- A minimum of 12 upper-division hours in the major must be taken in residence at ASU Main.
- Pass/Fail courses cannot be used for the major or related courses.
- Only 6 credits of 200-level GER German courses are applicable to the major.
- GER 202 is a prerequisite for GER 311, GER 312 and GER 313
- Course substitutions for heritage speakers and other advanced speakers of German are permissible.
