BACHELOR OF ARTS IN EDUCATION: GERMAN DEPARTMENT OF LANGUAGES & LITERATURES

The **BAE/GERMAN** specialization consists of 45 semester hours of credit, of which 30 hours must be in German, and 15 hours in a second language or in closely related fields to be approved by the German specialization advisor. Of the 30 hours in GERMAN a minimum of 24 hours must be taken above the second-year (200) level and must include at least 9 hours at the senior (400) level.

INITIAL TEACHER CERTIFICATION PROGRAM (ITC):

For specific College of Education ITC courses, consult with a College of Education advisor. Students should wait to apply to the ITC program until they have taken German courses on the 300-level. It is strongly recommended that the requirements in GERMAN be met fully <u>before</u> student teaching (SED 478) is undertaken. Exceptions will be permitted only upon the express recommendation of the supervising advisor in German.

Two methods courses, required as part of the ITC, are offered through the Department of Languages and Literatures: FLA 394 (Introduction to Teaching Foreign Languages), usually offered in Fall, and FLA 480 (Methods of Teaching Foreign Languages), usually offered in Spring.
