NOTES FOR MINOR and BIS EMPHASIS AREA:

- A grade of C or better must be achieved in all courses to be counted toward the minor or BIS emphasis area.
- A minimum of 6 upper-division hours in the minor or BIS emphasis area must be taken in residence at ASU Main.
- Pass/Fail courses cannot be used for the minor or BIS emphasis area.
- Only 6 credits of 200-level GER German courses are applicable to the minor or BIS emphasis area.
- GER 202 is a prerequisite for GER 311, GER 312 and GER 313
- Course substitutions are permitted for heritage speakers and other advanced speakers of German.
