NOTES FOR MAJOR:

- A grade of C or better must be achieved in all courses to be counted toward the major and related fields.
- A minimum of 12 upper-division hours in the major must be taken in residence at ASU Main.
- Pass/Fail courses cannot be used for the major or related courses.
- RUS 201 and 202 are not applicable to the major.
- Russian majors are encouraged to take related Slavic/East European language courses in the annual summer Critical Languages Institute (CLI). CLI courses may be applied toward the related field requirement.
- For Honors College students, RUS 493 Honors Thesis may replace the RUS/SLV 498 Senior Seminar requirement.
- Heritage Speakers and other advanced speakers of Russian will, with permission of the Slavic Section head, be admitted to an alternative track that includes *RUS 495 Russian for Heritage Speakers* for completion of the major.
