Student must take a total of 15 hours in Humanities and Fine Arts and Social and Behavioral Sciences, 6 in one area and 9 in the other. Three hours must be upper division.

NOTE: Community College courses do not satisfy upper-division requirement.

AWARENESS AREAS: (6 hours total)

All three areas are required; minimum of two courses required. A course may satisfy a core requirement and an awareness area simultaneously. Students are required to take at least 6 semesters in three different awareness areas.

CRITERIA FOR GRADUATION FROM ASU COLLEGE OF NURSING
(Student assumes full responsibility for meeting all graduation requirements.)

1. Meet all General Studies requirements of the University and all degree requirements of the College of Nursing with a grade of "C" or better.
2. 120 minimum total credit hours:
 - a. 64 credit hours Nursing
 - b. 56 credit hours General Studies and Electives
3. 45 minimum credit hours of Upper Division courses.
4. 64 maximum credit hours from Community Colleges.
5. 60 maximum credit hours by comprehensive exams.
6. 30 maximum credit hours taken in residence at ASU.
7. 60 credit hours taken in residence at ASU are required to be eligible for honors recognition.
8. The General Studies and Elective hours for some students may not add up to 56 because of transferring quarter hours of 2-3 credits instead of 3-4. Free electives may be taken to make the total of 120 credit hours required for graduation.
