Student must take a total of 15 hours in <u>Humanities and Fine Arts and Social and Behavioral Sciences</u>, 6 in one area and 9 in the other. Three hours must be upper division.

NOTE: Community College courses do not satisfy upper-division requirement.

AWARENESS AREAS: (6 hours total)

All three areas are required; minimum of two courses required. A course may satisfy a core requirement and an awareness area simultaneously. Students are required to take at least 6 semesters in three different awareness areas.

CRITERIA FOR GRADUATION FROM ASU COLLEGE OF NURSING (Student assumes full responsibility for meeting all graduation requirements.)

- 1. Meet all General Studies requirements of the University and all degree requirements of the College of Nursing with a grade of "C" or better.
- 2. 120 minimum total credit hours:
 - a. 64 credit hours Nursing
 - b. 56 credit hours General Studies and Electives
- 3. 45 minimum credit hours of Upper Division courses.
- 4. 64 maximum credit hours from Community Colleges.
- 5. 60 maximum credit hours by comprehensive exams.
- 6. 30 maximum credit hours taken in residence at ASU.
- 7. 60 credit hours taken in residence at ASU are required to be eligible for honors recognition.
- 8. The General Studies and Elective hours for some students may not add up to 56 because of transferring quarter hours of 2-3 credits instead of 3-4. Free electives may be taken to make the total of 120 credit hours required for graduation.
