III. LANGUAGE REQUIREMENT

- A. Two years of a foreign language, each with a minimum grade of C. Please submit a copy of your high school transcripts to BAC 581.
- B. Being an international student where the language is other than English and resident of another country. Please submit a copy of your passport to BAC 581.
- C. With a proficiency test confirming student's proficiency allows continuation in the second year of the language.
