However, the L, MA and CS requirements can be double counted in the college and major areas.

Unless otherwise noted only the main campus courses listed below will fulfill the bridge course requirement. When taking special topics courses numbered 294, 394, or 494 to meet the bridge course requirement, you may only use courses with the same course prefix, number, and title as those on the list.

<u>†Major Requirements Minimum Grade Requirements</u>: C min. required in all upper division course work. Some majors have more stringent requirements. Transfer courses subject to departmental approval.
