Although space is provided for your major, you must consult your major department (which, in most cases, has its own curriculum check sheet) for specific information concerning your field of specialization.

- Students normally receive advisement in their major departments.
- Students with transfer credits from schools outside of the Arizona Community College system or who have been disqualified should contact the Office of Undergraduate Programs, FOUND 110, (480) 965-6506.

REMINDER: Declarations of Graduation are due in FOUND 110 immediately after students enroll in their 87th hour. Deadlines: Fall semester, October 1. Spring semester, March 1.

In most major fields, students will be considered to have fulfilled the College Graduation requirement in the division of their major (Humanities, Social Sciences, or Natural Sciences and Mathematics). Chicana/o Studies and African and African American Studies majors fulfill the requirements of the division of their major concentration only. Women and Gender Studies majors may only fill the CLAS Social Sciences area with courses in their major.
