**For Catalog Years 1999-00, 2000-01 and 2001-02,** the requirements for the minor are the same as above, except that students may substitute SPA 413 Advanced Spanish Grammar for SPA 412 Advanced Conversation and Composition.

**Please note:**

- A minimum of 6 upper-division hours in the minor or BIS emphasis area must be taken in residence at ASU Main.
- A grade of C or better must be achieved in all courses for the minor and BIS emphasis area.
- Pass/Fail courses cannot be used for the minor or BIS emphasis area.
- SPA 311 and SPA 312 do not count towards the minor or BIS emphasis area in any catalog year.
- SPA 313 and SPA 314 (like SPA 315 and 316) must be taken in sequence.
- Course substitutions for SPA 313 and 314 (or 315 and 316) are permitted only for native speakers and more advanced students.
- You may not receive the minor or BIS emphasis area in a catalog year for which you are not eligible. If you are unsure of your catalog year, check with your major advisor or the DLL academic advisor.
