SUBTOTALS COLUMN ONE: \*The University General Studies combined HU and SB requirements requires a minimum of six hours in one area and nine in the other for a total of 15. (You cannot double count a literacy class with either a humanities or social behavioral for the university, however, you can double count a literacy class with the awareness areas)
