In most major fields, students will be considered to have fulfilled the College Graduation requirement in the division of their major (Humanities, Social Sciences, or Natural Sciences and Mathematics). Chicana/o Studies and African and African American Studies majors fulfill the requirements of the division of their major concentration only. Women and Gender Studies majors may only fill the CLAS Social Sciences area with courses in their major.

## MAJOR REQUIREMENTS

- A grade of C or better must be achieved in all courses at the 300 level or higher to be counted for the major. Some majors have more stringent requirements.
- A minimum of 12 upper-division hours in the major must be taken in residence at the Tempe campus.
