Bacclaureate Degree Requirements

Semester Hours Required

A minimum of 120 semester hours and 45 upper division semester hours (300 and 400 level courses) are required for a bachelor's degree.

First Year Composition Requirement

Students must demonstrate reasonable proficiency in written English by achieving a grade of "C" or better in both ENG 101 and 102 or ENG 105 or their equivalents. Should a student receive a grade lower than "C" in any of the courses, it must be repeated until the specified proficiency is demonstrated.

COLLEGE GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

NOTE: These College requirements are separate from the University General Studies requirements. Only courses whose prefixes are specified in the following lists qualify as College Graduation courses.

Second Language Requirement Each student is required to demonstrate proficiency by completing courses in a second language. Each student must demonstrate proficiency by completing the courses specified below with a grade of "C" or higher in each course. Second language course requirements consist of

- I. completion of second language course work at the intermediate level (202 or equivalent, those students completing this requirement in Ancient Greek must take both GRK 301 and 302; students completing the requirements in Portuguese or Romanian must complete POR 314 or ROM 314);
- II. a foreign language course at the 300 level or higher taught in the foreign language and having 202 or its equivalent as a prerequisite;
- III. completion of secondary education at a school in which the language of instruction is not English; or
- IV. completion of SHS 202 American Sign Language IV or its equivalent.
