ELECTIVES

- Up to two non-ENG film, literature, oral interpretation, theatre, or writing courses can be approved for use as electives in the English major. You must see an English advisor for pre-approval of such courses, and you may not use these classes in both the major and a minor.
- Up to four Writing Certificate courses can be used in both the major and the certificate.
