Notes:

1. **Introduction to Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, and Transgender Studies.** The introductory course will be taught once each fall and spring semester on a rotation basis. The schedule will be planned two years out and updated each year. The course will be taught under the prefix of the host department (e.g., if the course is taught in Social Work, it will carry the SWU prefix); the course will not be cross-listed; and the SCH will be credited to the host department.
2. **Capstone Experience.** All students will complete a 3 credit hour capstone experience after completing a minimum of 9 credit hours in the certificate program. The capstone experience will be supervised by any member of the faculty approved by the Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, and Transgender Studies Committee. The capstone experience should be an internship, community service project, or research apprenticeship that integrates curricular activities with each student's unique interests. The capstone experience should be based in principles of use-inspired, transformative research or creative activity that bridges the student's curriculum with lived experiences of LGBT communities. Ideally, the capstone experience integrates theory with experience, scholarship with change, and/or research with outcomes.
3. **Admission.** Students interested in admission to the certificate program should register with the chair of the Committee on Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, and Transgender Studies. All undergraduate students in good standing at the university are qualified for admission. Students may begin taking courses before they formally register for the certificate; however, they should meet with a member of the committee as soon as possible in order to select courses that most appropriately meet the student's individual needs.
4. **GPA Requirements.** All undergraduate students in ASU good academic standing are qualified for admission. All courses taken in the certificate or BIS concentration must be completed with a grade of "C" (2.0) or better.
5. **Residency.** Twelve hours within the certificate must be completed at Arizona State University. Students with transfer credits that may be eligible for inclusion in the certificate should meet Casey Self or Sandra Voller in University College Academic Advising (480-965-4464).
6. **Overrides and Course Restrictions.** Overrides, prerequisites, corequisites and other restrictions for individual courses are determined by the academic school, department or program offering the course. Please contact the department or instructor offering the course for authorization procedures.
