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Baccalaureate Degree Requirements

Semester Hours Required A minimum of 120 semester hours and 45 upper-division semester hours (300 and 400 level courses) are required for a bachelor's degree.

First Year Composition Requirement Students must demonstrate reasonable proficiency in written English by achieving a grade of "C" or better in both ENG 101 and 102 or in ENG 105 or their equivalents. Should a student receive a grade lower than "C" in any of the courses, it must be repeated until the specified proficiency is demonstrated.

General Studies Requirements
All undergraduate students in the College of
Public Programs are required to complete the
university General Studies requirements in order
to be eligible for graduation in any of the
undergraduate curricula offered by the college.
Many general studies requirements may
simultaneously fulfill college and major
requirements.

Computer Science Requirement

A computer science course is required for all undergraduate majors in the College of Public Programs. Any CS course from the university General Studies list that involves the use of computer application skills is acceptable. It may be included within the Mathematical Studies requirement where appropriate. Please see your academic advisor for a complete list of acceptable courses. Limitation on Physical Education Activity

No more than eight hours of physical education activity courses may be counted within the minimum 120 hours required for graduation.

Pass/Fail Option

The College of Public Programs does not offer any courses for pass/fail credit. Courses completed for pass/fail credit outside the College of Public Programs may count only as elective credit in meeting degree requirements.

The School of Community Resources & Development Bachelor of Science Tourism Development & Management

The Bachelor of Science in Tourism Development & Management degree program in the School of Community Resources & Development exposes the student to the businesses of nature-based tourism, heritage tourism, and meeting and convention planning. By graduation, the tourism development & management student will have acquired the planning and development skills needed for a successful career in the fast-growing travel and tourism industry.

Admission to Professional Status
Upon admission to the university, tourism
development & management students are
classified as pre-professional status. The School
of Community Resources & Development
requires a minimum of 56 semester hours with a
minimum of 2.50 cumulative GPA before being
officially admitted with professional status.
Upper division professional courses within the
tourism development & management program
cannot be taken until professional status is
attained. Transfer students who have completed
56 semester hours or more at another institution
must remove any scholastic deficiencies before
being admitted with professional status.

Students may achieve professional status by completing a minimum of 56 semester hours including the following:

- ENG 101 and 102 or equivalent (grade of "C" or better)
- College of Public Programs writing competence requirement
- University math requirement: MAT 142 or higher
- College of Public Programs computer requirement

- College of Public Programs communication requirement
- PRM 120 Leisure and the Quality of Life ("C" or better)
- TDM 210 Community Services and Professions ("C" or better)
