**AWARENESS AREAS: (6 hours total)**

**CRITERIA FOR GRADUATION**

1. **Meet all university graduation requirements (see catalog for details).**
  - Completion of a minimum of 120 total credit hours required for the BSN degree.
  - Completion of a minimum of 45 upper division credit hours.
  - Completion of a minimum of 30 credit hours in residence at the ASU campus from which the student will graduate.
  - A maximum of 60 credit hours in independent learning courses and/or earned by comprehensive exams are accepted for credit toward the baccalaureate degree.
  - A minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.00 for all courses taken at ASU is required to graduate with a baccalaureate degree.
2. **Meet all College of Nursing and nursing major requirements.**

**Academic Recognition:**

  - Completion of at least 56 credit hours in residence at ASU is required to be eligible for graduation with academic recognition for a baccalaureate degree.
