Classes

These eighteen (18) credit hours are the minimum requirement needed for the minor/BIS Concentration Area, of which twelve (12) credit hours are upper division. Any transfer courses used as substitutes for the upper division courses must be upper division courses; comparable courses taken at the community college may satisfy the course requirement in the minor/BIS Concentration Area, but additional related upper division courses may be required to meet the 12 credit hour minimum for upper division credits; see an advisor for acceptable course substitutes. These courses are sequential and carry pre-requisites in order to support the students understanding of the subject matter; consult the general catalog for pre-requisites.

Eligibility

The minor/BIS Concentration Area is open to all students. In order to pursue and complete the minor/BIS Concentration area in Interior Design History, students must have a 2.50 cum GPA.
