MINOR and BIS CONCENTRATION AREA in LANDSCAPE STUDIES

The minor/BIS Concentration Area in Landscape Studies is designed for students who have an interest in landscape aesthetics, but are pursuing a major in another field. The course selection is intended to provide greater understanding of landscape issues that may be relevant in related professional disciplines and to broaden knowledge about the landscape in which we live.

Students must complete a minimum of 18 credit hours from the following list of courses of which 12 credit hours must be upper-division.
