Area and Period Courses*

- ENG ___ an upper-division course in literature before 1660, exclusive of ENG 303, 321, 355, 356, and 421

- ENG ___ an upper-division course in literature after 1900

Additional hours needed to complete the 45 hours are free electives chosen from the department's offerings at the 200 level or above (courses in related disciplines may sometimes be used with advisor approval—see reverse):

[^]VARIABLE/SPECIAL TOPICS COURSES

- Each semester, a range of other upper-division variable topics (see below) and special topics (e.g., 294, 394, 494) courses will work to fulfill these requirements. For that semester's list, see Dept. of English, English Undergraduate Academic Advisor, or Blackboard site for English majors.
- Certain ENG course numbers may be repeated for credit when topics vary. See course descriptions in the *ASU General Catalog*.

Electives

- Any ENG course at the 200 level or above will work here.
- Internships (ENG 484) are encouraged. See Mr. Robert Haynes, Internship Coordinator, Department of English.
- Up to 2 non-ENG courses closely related to English studies can be approved for use as electives in the major. You must see an English advisor for pre-approval of such courses, and you may not use these classes in both the major and a minor.
- Up to 4 Writing Certificate courses can be used in both the major and the certificate.
