## The School of Community Resources & Development Bachelor of Science Parks & Recreation Management

**Definition of the field:** The parks and recreation field emerged from the youth development, recreation, and park movements of the late 19th century. Today, the recreation related professions represent a diverse field focusing on the role of leisure in youth and adult development, of parks/open space to community quality of life, of leisure, sports and natural resource tourism to economic and community development, and providing human services in meeting community needs. These professions address challenges related to providing accessible leisure services, visitor opportunities, environmental quality of life, social problems, and services to disadvantaged populations. The school is committed to training professionals dedicated to the parks and recreation professions, building a sense of community, and enhancing the quality of life in today's society.

**Career opportunities in the field:** The BS Parks & Recreation Management prepares students for professional positions in a variety of public, private, and nonprofit organizations. Graduates are employed in a variety of settings in Arizona, nationally, and abroad. Our graduates find employment in such diverse settings as youth agencies, municipal park and recreation departments, county and state park agencies, tour operators, sport venues, commercial recreation, special event management, hospitals, and federal natural resource agencies that manage parks, forests and public lands. In such settings, graduates design, develop, and manage services that address the recreation needs of a particular clientele. Typical entry level salaries range from \$28,000 to \$40,000.

**Uniqueness of the program at ASU:** The BS Parks & Recreation Management provides an interdisciplinary education in the management of community based recreation services, parks, protected areas and commercial recreation services. Students learn to integrate the managerial, natural and social sciences to make informed decisions for recreation service delivery. The curriculum combines classroom instruction with field experiences and covers parks and recreation policy, programming, planning, management, communication, inclusive services, and history. This degree program is accredited by the National Recreation and Park Association (NRPA).

### **Baccalaureate Degree Requirements**

#### Semester Hours Required

A minimum of 120 semester hours and 45 upper-division semester hours (300 and 400 level courses) are required for a bachelor's degree.

### First Year Composition Requirement

Students must demonstrate reasonable proficiency in written English by achieving a grade of "C" or better in both ENG 101 and 102 or in ENG 105 or their equivalents. Should a student receive a grade lower than "C" in any of the courses, it must be repeated until the specified proficiency is demonstrated.

**General Studies Requirements:** The General Studies program requirement consists of 35 semester hours intended to provide every student pursuing an undergraduate degree basic skills and familiarity with traditional areas of knowledge. Introductory and advanced courses are required and students may select from an approved menu of courses. The General Studies program consists of five "core" areas and three "awareness" areas. The core areas are Literacy and Critical Inquiry, Mathematical Studies, Humanities and Fine Arts, Social and Behavioral Sciences, and Natural Sciences. The three awareness areas are Global Awareness, Historical Awareness, and Cultural Diversity in the United States. Students must take 35 semester hours in the five core areas, including nine semester hours in the three awareness areas. A large number of courses within the core areas concurrently satisfy the awareness requirements as well. Consult the General Catalog for details.

**Major Requirements:** The major requirements of this Bachelor of Science degree program consist of completing 9 hours of Community Resources & Development core courses, 9 hours of Parks & Recreation Management foundation courses, 22 hours of Parks & Recreation Management professional core courses, and 24 hours of Park & Recreation Management related courses. All coursework, except for PRM 463 Senior Internship, and the 200 hours of career field experience must be completed before a student is eligible to register for PRM 463 Senior Internship. Students are not permitted to take additional course work during their senior internship placement. PRM 463 Senior Internship is intended to be the final course before graduation. Approval of internships must be requested from the School of Community Resources & Development. A student must attain a grade of "C" or higher in all courses within the major, including the related area.
