**CONSTITUTION REQUIREMENTS**

- To be completed within three years of certification:
- a. ASU at the West campus courses:
    - POL 110 or 310 (US)
    - POL 417 (AZ)
  - b. Community college equivalents:
    - POS 221 (AZ)
    - POS 222 (US)
    - POS 220 (US & AZ)
  - c. Passing scores on appropriate tests

The US and Arizona Constitution requirements must be satisfied for teacher certification but are not required for graduation from ASU's West campus.

**CREDIT REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADUATION**

A minimum of 120 semester hours are required for graduation with a baccalaureate degree from ASU at the West campus. These must include:

- 50 upper division semester hours
- 30 semester hours MINIMUM at ASU at the West Campus.

Note: 64 semester hours MAXIMUM from community college(s) applicable to B.A.E.

Graduates of Elementary Education/English as a Second Language will be eligible for certification in Elementary Education with an English as a Second Language endorsement (1-8).
