CREDIT REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADUATION

A minimum of 120 semester hours are required for graduation with a baccalaureate degree from ASU at the West campus. These must include:

- 50 upper division semester hours
- · 30 semester hours MINIMUM at ASU West

Note: 64 semester hours MAXIMUM from community college(s) applicable to B.A.E.

Graduates of Elementary Education will be eligible for certification in Elementary Education (1-8).
