

BAE in Secondary Education (Economics)

College of Education students complete pre-professional coursework and then apply to the Initial Teacher Certification (ITC) program in the second semester of their sophomore year.

Students are NOT guaranteed admission into the ITC program. Admission is based on a competitive application process.

Academic Specialization Admission Requirements

The following courses must be completed with a "C" or higher **before** applying to the ITC program:

- ECN 111: Macroeconomic Principles
- ECN 112: Microeconomic Principles
- ECN 313: Intermediate Macroeconomic Theory
- ECN 314: Intermediate Microeconomic Theory
- MAT 210: Brief Calculus

Additional Information

- Registration in field experience is required for each semester in the program.
- All specialization courses, general studies, and ITC courses must be completed prior to student teaching.
- A "C" grade minimum is required in academic specialization and ITC courses.

Academic Advising

All newly admitted students to the ASU College of Education are admitted as pre-professional education majors. Pre-professional students are advised by a team of academic advisors whose primary focus is on preparing students for the Initial Teacher Certification (ITC) program during their junior year. Pre-professional students are strongly encouraged to meet each semester with the pre-professional team of advisors to ensure proper progression through their chosen major. It is crucial that all applicants seeking application to the ITC program gain valuable experience with the population of students they intend to teach; the Office of Student Services can provide information on various opportunities to gain such experience.

Once admitted to the ITC, students are assigned to a professional program advisor.
