CONSTITUTION REQUIREMENTS

To be completed within three years of certification: (One year for Secondary History/Social Studies):

- a. ASU at the West campus courses:
POL 110 or 310 (US)
POL 417 (AZ)
- b. Community college equivalents:
POS 221 (AZ)
POS 222 (US)
POS 220 (US & AZ)
- c. Passing scores on appropriate tests

The US and Arizona Constitution requirements must be satisfied for teacher certification but are not required for graduation from ASU at the West campus.

CREDIT REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADUATION

A minimum of 120 semester hours are required for graduation with a baccalaureate degree from ASU at the West campus. These must include:

- 50 upper division semester hours
- 30 semester hours MINIMUM at ASU West

Note: 64 semester hours MAXIMUM from community college(s) applicable to B.A.E.

Graduates of Elementary Education will be eligible for certification in Elementary Education (1-8).
