**Nutrition Communication Concentration**

[All degrees require 120 total credit hours, of which 45 must be upper division (300 and 400 level). Students may transfer up to 64 lower division credits from community, junior, or two-year colleges.] Degree requirements include proficiency and general requirements for the University, the Department of Nutrition, and this specific concentration of Nutrition Communication.
